

# MLA Report Card – Barnala Assembly

## Overall Score:

59.3 / 100 → Grade: C+ (Aspirant–Performer Borderline)

## Rural Report Card (PAI Performance)

- **Total Gram Panchayats Covered:** 22
- **Average Overall PAI Score:** 60.32 / 100
- **MLA Rural Score:** 54 / 90
- **Status:** B – Performer

### Strengths:

- Panchayats like **Badbar (65.27)** and **Dangarh (64.04)** are in strong Performer band.
- Many Panchayats consistently score around 60, showing stable performance.
- Themes like **Clean & Green Panchayat** and **Child-Friendly Panchayat** are improving.

### Weaknesses:

- Overall average still low at 60.32 → borderline between Aspirant and Performer.
  - Bottom GP **Kothe Ramsar (53.27)** and others close to Aspirant grade.
  - Persistent weaknesses in **Infrastructure, Women-Friendly Panchayat, Social Justice**.

## Health Report Card (Barnala District Hospital)

- **MLA Health Score:** 4 / 7
- **Status:** C – Aspirant

### Strengths:

- **Beds almost adequate** (160 available vs. 164 required; only 2% shortage).
- Ambulance and core OPD/diagnostics functional.

### Weaknesses:

- **ICU not available.**
  - Shortages: **34% doctors, 37% nurses, 58% support staff.**
  - No medical/social audits conducted (2016–21).

## 🏠 Housing Report Card (PMAY-U – Barnala Municipality)

- **Houses Sanctioned:** 1,713
- **Grounded:** 801 (46.8%)
- **Completed:** 560 (32.7%)
- **MLA Housing Score:** 1 / 3
- **Status:** D – Weak

**Interpretation:** Poor implementation → less than one-third houses completed.

### ✓ Strengths

- Rural governance stable, Barnala DH nearly adequate in bed capacity.
- Panchayats like Badbar, Dangarh, Bhaini Jassa show good rural governance scores.

### ✗ Weaknesses

- Housing under PMAY-U is very weak (only 32.7% completion).
  - Serious staff shortages in health services.
  - Rural governance average (60.32) is below top-performing districts (>65).
