- **Combined Average:** **51.66 / 100 → Grade: C (Aspirant)**

✓ Functioning Gram Panchayats with average documentation and meeting regularity.

Theme Strengths: Basic service delivery improving.

Weakness: Low participatory governance culture, inconsistent Gram Sabha meetings.

- ⚠ 51% bed shortage compared to IPHS norms.
 - ⚠ Diagnostic infrastructure adequate but not ideal for district population load.

 - Slow housing project completion and infrastructure backlog.
